- how home mechanical ventilation has evolved over the last century, regarding technology, indications, and utilization patterns in different countries
- how to interpret a home bi-level device or ventilator "download" to ensure optimal ventilator support in the home setting
- the benefits of lung volume recruitment and secretion management techniques in NMD
- practical aspects of initiation and follow-up of mouthpiece ventilation
- the pathophysiology of diaphragm dysfunction in the ICU based on current literature
- the current and emerging role of diaphragm ultrasound, particularly in the ICU setting
- utility and pitfalls of phrenic nerve and diaphragm EMG studies as diagnostic tools
- indications for diaphragm pacing
- pros and cons of diaphragm pacing in various specific disorders

Anticipated Practice Outcomes

Participants will be able

to apply gained knowledge on current diagnostic and management tools for neuromuscular diseases (NMD), to better understand prognosis with modern management tools, and be able to manage their patients by more appropriately prescribing relevant tests, therapies and judicious referrals.
